The Parable of the Talents is a well-known story. Proclaiming it as the liturgical year nears its close serves as a reminder that in the interim before the parousia comes and the final judgment occurs, we need to live faithfully, actively taking responsibility for the talents we have been given according to our abilities. In Jesus' time a talent was a high-value unit of currency. It could vary in its worth based on the metal and where it was made. In the English language, we use the word "talent" to refer to a gift or skill one has. Notice that after having spoken with the servants, the master leaves, and then "After a long time" he comes back to settle accounts with his servants. Biblical exegetes in the early Church understood the master as Christ, his leaving as Christ's Ascension, and the master's return as Christ's second coming at the parousia. How the servants acted in response to the talents they had been given provided an example of how believers are to live in the time

before the parousia. The first two servants were faithful to what they had been given. Their production of more talents led to the master giving them greater responsibilities and, perhaps more significantly, as this Gospel is proclaimed near the end of the liturgical year, to their participation in the kingdom of God – their master's joy. The third servant, the lazy servant, shows believers how not to live. Responsibility for living according to our faith cannot be put off. Idleness and apathy have consequences. The master's scolding of this servant leads to the most severe consequence: the servant is thrown into the darkness, presumably hell, for his irresponsibility.
