HOLY WEEK:

Lent is a time that is as if we move from joy and celebration to utter defeat and emptiness. However, that is the essence of our entire journey, and our beginning of Holy Week, which is today. During this holiest of weeks we are beginning. Christ presents the great contradiction of the way He was praised and loved by some and reviled by others. Just as this Palm Sunday opens with joy and closes with seeming sorrow, our Holy week follows the same formula — including His death for us on the Cross. but closing with a complete sense of triumph.

This Gospel is vivid; it is, so to speak, a "slap in our faces." The joy of the beginning of the Mass is contrasted against the betrayal of Jesus by a trusted friend... His bloody suffering at A woman prepares Jesus for the hands of Pilate and the Romans... His utter humiliation as He carried a Cross through the city to a jeering crowd... and His final pain and degradation as He is nailed to the Cross and He dies.

The steward understands that she/he travels with the Lord every step of the way, from the highs to the lows, from triumph to evident disaster. Throughout Lent we have been striving to deepen our relationship with Him. Nevertheless, when it comes right down to it, we may resist His invitation to us because it can mean pain, sacrifice, and suffering. That is why we must experience Lent. That is why we must experience His Passion. And that is why next week on Easter Sunday we will arise with the Lord in triumph, joy, and celebration. Truly, "Blessed is He who comes in the name of the Lord."
