READINGS

December 11, 2016 Third Sunday of Advent

First Reading: Isaiah 35: 1-6A, 10

Second Reading: James 5: 7-10

Gospel: Matthew 11: 2-11

Last Sunday's reading from Matthew introduced John the Baptist's call to repent in order to prepare for the arrival of God's final rule, which he described as "the coming wrath." He indicated awareness that he himself was not the Messiah, but his forerunner. At the time of today's reading, the imprisoned Baptist sends some of his followers to Jesus to inquire if he is the Christ. Matthew implies that John recognizes a difference in the message of the two men concerning the arrival of the end time. Whereas the Baptist emphasized divine anger and judgment, Jesus' ministry up to this time has embodied healing and mercy. The discrepancy leads John to pose a direct question to Jesus: are you God's Messiah or are you not? As is common in Matthew. Jesus refers to the Old Testament Scriptures from the prophet Isaiah that envision future salvation as a time of merciful healing, wholeness, and re-creation of all things. He adds a gentle admonition to John, urging him to take "no

offense" at Jesus' activity. The Messiah's words seem to insist that human expectations cannot and must not govern God's saving action on behalf of sick and wounded humankind. Jesus then turns to the crowds to clarify the Baptist's important role in the unfolding of God's plan of salvation; he is the prophet-like-Elijah described by Malachi, who had proclaimed that a new and final prophet in the pattern of Elijah would appear as God's messenger to signal the arrival of the age of salvation. John, states Jesus, is that very messenger.
