IN THE SACRAMENTS WE ENCOUNTER CHRIST the SAVIOR

On July 22nd we celebrate **SAINT MARY MAGDALENE**: a witness of the saving power of Christ's Resurrection, and icon of conversion. Mary Magdalene had been plagued by seven demons. Traditionally, the number seven implies completion. So Mary Magdalene was completely lost, completely given over to evil. It is this "hopeless" case whose heart was changed by her encounter with Jesus, and who was chosen to be the first witness to the Resurrected Christ. Jesus' desire and power to save us are not stopped by seven demons. Jesus does not recoil from even the deepest darkness, because darkness is

nothing before His light. If our humble amazement at how much Jesus can forgive is kept alive, it brings us to cherish the Sacrament of Confession as a continual conversion and a deeper experience of the love and mercy of Christ. Let us pray that all of us may trust in the infinite mercy of Christ. May our humble amazement make us follow in the footsteps of her who ran to tell the Apostles, "***I have seen the Lord!***"
