All Saints Day is a day on which we thank God for giving ordinary men and women a share in His holiness and Heavenly glory as a reward for their Faith. In fact, we celebrate the feast of each canonized saint on a particular day of the year. But there are countless other saints and martyrs, men, women and children united with God in Heavenly glory, whose feasts we do not celebrate. All Saints' Day is intended to honor their memory. The feast is observed to teach us to honor the saints, both by imitating their lives and by seeking their intercession for us. Today, the Church reminds us that God's call for holiness is universal, that all of us are called to live in His love and to make His love real in the lives of those around us. *Reasons why we honor the saints:* (1) The saints put their trust in Christ and lived heroic lives of Faith. (2) The saints are our role models, teaching us that Christ's holy life of un-

conditional love, mercy, and forgiveness can be lived by ordinary people of all walks of life and at all times. (3) The saints are our heavenly mediators who intercede for us. (4) The saints are the instruments that God uses to work miracles at present. This feast offers a challenge to each one of us: anybody can become a saint, regardless of his or her age, lifestyle or living conditions. St. Augustine accepted this challenge when he asked the question: "If others can become saints, why can't I?" On the feast of All Saints the Church invites us and challenges us to walk the walk of the saints and not just talk the talk. Today is also a day for us to pray to the saints, asking them to pray on our behalf that we may live our lives in faithfulness like theirs, and so receive the same reward.
